2015 SUSTAINABILITY ACHIEVEMENTS

- · Completed seven LEED-certified buildings
- · Diverted construction waste totaling more than 2,500 tons from landfills
- Implemented minimum basis of design sustainability standards for all Rockford development projects (i.e. low-water-use plumbing fixtures, energy modeling, commissioning, etc.)
- Saved 12,000+ pounds with our corporate composting program and recycled 3.75+ tons through our recycling program
- Received ENERGY STAR rating for our corporate office by consciously lowering and monitoring resource and utility use: http://www.energystar.gov/
- Operated 48% more efficiently than a comparable office of our size, amounting in approximately \$30,000 yearly savings
- Saved more than 21,000 miles of travel for office staff through our carpooling program
- Participated in several Westside neighborhood cleanups
- Launched "Sustainovation", an informal meeting for individuals interested in Sustainability
 and Innovation to share ideas, brainstorm and dream. We held three events with topics

- Installed an additional photovoltaic (PV) system and more efficient lighting controls at Wealthy Street Theatre

- Completed a Universal Design project, aimed to promote accessibility, at the Southeast Mary Free Bed YMCA
- Logged 600+ employee biking miles on the office bicycles through our corporate wellness program. We are currently registered as a Bicycle Friendly Business.
